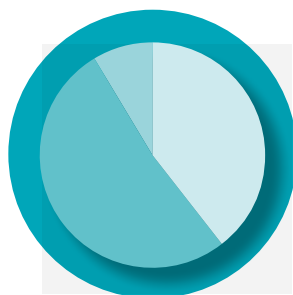

### NFSS Food Donation By Channel in Canada



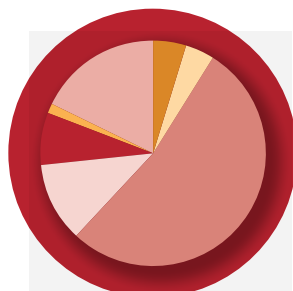

**9,853,832 lbs** through corporate donations of which **1,121,024 lbs** were fruits and vegetables

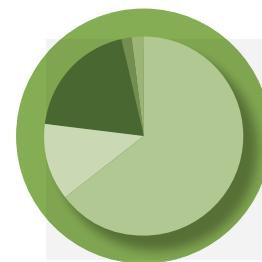

### Food Logistics

**\$1,055,182** in transportation and warehouse services were provided to move **9,853,832 lbs** of food and consumer products into various locations in Canada.

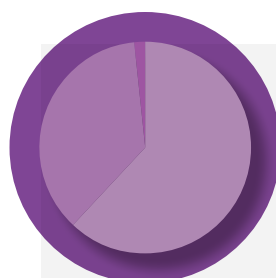

Financial support, donations of food and consumer products, and resources and education all combine to form assistance for our neighbours. Here are some highlights...

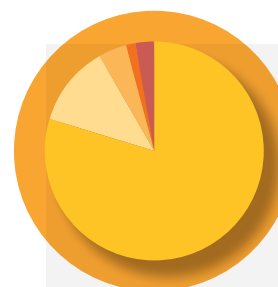
A total of **\$9,740,105** in funds were shared with provincial associations and food banks across Canada.

In addition, food banks in Canada received **\$3,103,997** directly from donors through nationally coordinated campaigns.
